Ice, snow, and cold weather can make life a little tougher for bus riders and bus drivers.

Here are some tips to keep your winter trips as pleasant as possible.

- 1. Dress warmly—If you miss your bus or your bus is running behind, you want to be warm while you wait!
- 2. Use Bus Tracker–While you wait (hopefully indoors) your phone can tell you in real time when your bus will arrive. Go to PaceBus. com and click Bus Tracker to learn more.
- 3. Don't be shy-It gets dark early in the winter. To make sure we see you, stand close to the bus stop sign and give the bus a big wave when it approaches.
- 4. Sign-Up for E-mail Notifications so you can be informed of Detours/Passenger Alert notices affecting your route.

Avoid Crowded Mall Parking Lots!

Holiday shopping doesn't have to involve hunting for a parking space in a sea of cars! Pace's I-90 Express Service can take you to several of the region's premier retail destinations through connections with two 'circulators' that serve shopping districts. Service on both circulator routes is free!

Schaumburg--Schaumburg's Woodfield Trolley serves Streets of Woodfield, Woodfield Mall, and several shopping locations north of Golf Road. The Trolley also picks up riders at Renaissance Schaumburg Hotel and Pace Northwest Transportation Center (NWTC).

VENTRA 2.0 UPDATE



Pace riders can expect change and improvement with the Ventra app in 2019. The updated mobile app will have new and expanded features including a new trip planner, easier and quicker navigation through ticketing and account management, and expanded options for favorite stops and transit tracking.

As cards expire, we are

continuing to replace them with cards that will not expire for twenty years, yet still offer the same functions and reliability as the original Ventra cards.

A NEW PARK-N-RIDES

I-90/Barrington Road Park-n-Ride Station

The region's first-ever highway-based bus rapid transit station has come to Hoffman Estates! On August 13, 2018, Pace opened the I-90/Barrington Road Station, which includes a 170-space parkn-ride lot and two "inline stations" (one in each direction) which allows express buses to pick up riders without exiting the highway. A pedestrian bridge over the tollway and two tunnels passing beneath ramps allow commuters to access eastbound and westbound buses with ease.

Plainfield Park-n-Ride Station

Site work and the parking lot were completed, along with a temporary bus loading area, so the new Plainfield Park-n-Ride opened for service on August 13, 2018. Parking lot capacity is 600 cars, and current usage is around 330. The building is scheduled for a grand opening at a later time. Due to cold weather conditions, the bus canopies will not be installed until spring of 2019.

BOARD APPROVES 2019 BUDGET

Pace's Board of Directors approved the agency's proposed 2019 budget at their November meeting.

The budget includes \$1.7 million in service enhancements, including Pulse Milwaukee Line. The budget also includes service reductions affecting the 12 routes listed, which do not meet minimum standards for efficiency, productivity, and ridership.

Pace will implement these changes by April 2019. Two additional routes were spared from elimination thanks to community input; their performance will be reevaluated next year.
