Two recent bills passed by the U.S. Congress and signed by President Obama are of significant benefit to Pace and transit agencies nationwide. We thank our congressional delegation for their support and look forward to more federal investment in infrastructure in the future.

In December, Congress passed and President Obama signed the FAST Act transportation bill authorizing \$305 billion for transportation infrastructure, which includes \$61 billion for public transit. Pace will use its share to buy buses and to repair infrastructure.

Congress also increased the tax benefit transit riders receive when paying with pre-tax payroll deduction from \$130 to \$255 per month. Ask your employer if they offer this money-saving benefit.

While there is still much work to do to bring Chicagoland's public transportation infrastructure up to a state of good repair, the increase in federal funding is helpful. New buses will reduce Pace's costs and improve our on-time performance.





UPCOMING TITLE VI PUBLIC HEARINGS

Title VI of The Civil Rights Act of 1964 protects people from discrimination based on race, color or national origin. As a recipient of federal financial assistance funds, Pace follows all Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Title VI federal regulations and guidance to comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act, which governs transit.

Since Pace is proposing several changes to its Title VI Program, we are seeking public input before submitting them to the FTA. It is imperative to Pace that none of the planned changes have any discriminatory impact. Public hearings are scheduled for late February to discuss them. Fares and bus service are not impacted; see on-board notices and PaceBus.com for hearing dates and locations.



GET A VENTRA CARD TO AVOID HIGHER CASH FARES

Most Pace customers already know that using Ventra is so much more convenient than paying with cash - and as of January 1, Ventra is also cheaper! A new fare policy charges cash paying customers \$2.00 per one way trip but rides with Ventra are only \$1.75 (\$0.85 for reduced fare cardholders.) ADA Paratransit and Dial-a-Ride fares remain unchanged.

Ventra users also get 25-cent transfers, access to moneysaving passes, and the security of knowing their passes and transit value are safe if your Ventra Card is lost or stolen.
