Pace Vanpool Service

With the Pace Vanpool service, commuters who live near each other and share similar work hours can form a travel group that has a primary and backup driver and a few riders. Pace supplies the van and manages the program. Vanpoolers who volunteer to be the primary driver traveling with 4+ commuters participate at no cost. Rider's participation status is determined as full-time when utilizing the vanpool for 4 or more days per week and part-time for vanpooling 3 days or less per week. Monthly fares cover fuel, maintenance, insurance, tolls, roadside assistance and van washes. The larger the group, the bigger the savings!

Drivers can reduce car ownership, wear and tear on a personal vehicle and lower their personal auto insurance. Riders can enjoy a relaxing and reliable commute, connect with others, and use their travel time. A Guaranteed Ride Home is available for personal emergencies. Participants get up to \$125 per year for transportation.

Pace Fixed Route Bus System

With fixed routes serving Cook, DuPage, Kane, Lake, McHenry, and Will counties, Pace provides fast and reliable bus service that could connect you to where you want to go. This service runs on set schedules along designated routes across 274 communities. Try our regular routes, Express, Bus on Shoulder and Pulse services. Pace On Demand

On Demand is a flexible bus service that operates within designated zones located throughout the suburbs. Riders book a trip online or call at least one hour (or up to 7 days) in advance and pay with Ventra, cash, contactless bankcard, or mobile wallet. Commuters can choose to pay with exact cash or Ventra, the fare payment system for Pace, Metra and CTA buses and trains.
